TO THE MEMBERS OF MATCHIFY SERVICES PRIVATE LIMITED,

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of **MATCHIFY SERVICES PRIVATE LIMITED** ("the company"), which comprises the Balance Sheet as at 31 March 2017, the Statement of Profit and Loss, the Cash Flow Statement for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the matters in section 134(5) of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") with respect to the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance and cash flows of the Company in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Act, read with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014. This responsibility also includes the maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provision of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting the frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of internal financial control, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We have taken into account the provisions of the Act, the accounting and auditing standards and matters which are required to be included in the audit report under the provisions of the Act and the Rules made there under. We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing specified under section 143(10) of the Act. Those Standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement. An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal financial control relevant to the Company's preparation of the financial statements that give true and fair view in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of the accounting estimates made by Company's Directors, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion on the financial statements.

Opinion

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements, give the information required by the Act in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India;

- a) In the case of the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2017;
- b) In the case of the Statement of Profit and Loss, of the Loss for the year ended on that date; and
- c) In the case of the Cash Flow Statement, of the cash flows for the year ended on that date.

Emphasis of Matters

We draw attention to the following matters in the Notes to the financial statements:

The Financial statement read with Notes on Accounts indicates that the Company has accumulated losses and its Net worth has been substantially eroded, the Company has also incurred a net cash loss during the current year and previous year further company also plans to phase out its operation, these conditions indicate the existence of a material uncertainty that cast significant doubt about the Company's ability to continue as a going concern. However, the financial statements of the Company have been prepared on a going concern basis for the reasons stated in the said Note.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of these matters.

Report on other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

 - h) with respect to the other matters to be included in the Auditors' Report in accordance with Rule 11 of the Companies (Audit and Auditors) Rules, 2014, in our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us:
 - i. The Company does not have any pending litigations which would impact its financial position.
 - ii. The Company did not have any long-term contracts including derivatives contracts for which there were any material foreseeable losses.
 - iii. There has been no delay in transferring amounts, required to be transferred, to the Investor Education and Protection Fund by the Company.

Background:

Matchify Services Private Limited is engaged in the business of providing match making services through mobile application, internet platform and to carry out all match making related activities and services through both online and offline channels.

The Management has decided to phase out the operations of the Company, since the operations not generating revenue and there is no likelihood of revenue generation in the near future.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared on historical cost convention based on accrual method of accounting and in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India and comply with the mandatory accounting standards notified by the Central Government of India under the Companies (Account) Rules, 2014 as amended and with the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013.

2. Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires the management to make estimates and assumptions considered in the reported amounts of assets and liabilities including the disclosure of contingent liabilities as of the date of the financial statements and the reported income and expenses during the reporting period. Management believes that the estimates used in preparation of the financial statements are prudent and reasonable. Actual results could vary from these estimates. Any revision to accounting estimates is recognised in the period in which the results are known / materialized.

3. Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognized to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the company and the revenue can be reliably measured.

4. Fixed Assets and Depreciation

- i) Fixed Assets are stated at historical cost. Cost comprises of the purchase price and any attributable cost of bringing the assets to its working condition for its intended use.
- ii) Depreciation on tangible fixed assets is provided based on the straight-line method over the useful lives estimated by the management. Depreciation for assets purchased/sold during the year is proportionately charged. The Management estimates the useful lives for the assets as follows:

Particulars	Useful life (in years)
Furniture and Fixtures	2-5
Computer and Network Equipment	4-6
Office Equipment	2-7

iii) Computer software is depreciated using the straight-line method over a period based on management's estimate of useful lives of such software (3 years), or over the license period of the software, whichever is shorter.

iv) Based on technical evaluation, the management believes that the useful life as given above best represent the period which the Management expects to use these assets. Hence, the useful lives for these assets are different from the useful lives as prescribed under Part C of Schedule II of the Companies Act 2013.

v) Assets individually costing less than Rs.5,000/- each are fully depreciated in the year of purchase.

vi) Projects under which assets are not ready for their intended use and other capital work-in-progress are carried at cost, comprising direct cost, related incidental expenses and attributable interest.

5. Income taxes

a) Current tax is determined on income for the year chargeable to tax in accordance with the provisions of Income Tax Act, 1961.

b) Deferred tax is recognised on timing differences between the accounting income and the taxable income for the year, and quantified using the tax rates and laws enacted or substantially enacted as on the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent there is a reasonable certainty that assets can be realised in future, however where there is unabsorbed depreciation or carry forward of losses, deferred tax assets are recognised only if there is a virtual certainty of realisation of such assets.

6. Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets

A provision is recognised when the Company has a present obligation as a result of past event; it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions are not discounted to its present value and are determined based on best estimate required to settle the obligation at the Balance Sheet date. These are reviewed at each Balance Sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.
